Growth area:	Australia and cultivated in South- Africa, the United States and India.
Trees:	The trunk can reach a height of about 30m and a diameter of about 1m.
Description:	The wood is goldish brown of colour and can develop into a black walnut like colour.
Texture/Figure:	Straight grain. Fine texture.
Machining:	Is easy to machine. Carefully drying advised. Good species for woodworking.
Gluing:	Well.
Drying:	A slow drying scheme is necessary.
Fixation:	Keeps nails and screws well, pre- drilling necessary.



Durability class: Class II/III.

Density: Moisture content 12%: 530 - 850 kg / m3.

Modulus of Elasticity: 14810 N/mm2 (Moisture content 12-15%).

Applications: Furniture, interior- and exterior joinery, construction timber, musical instruments, billiard cues.
